

The Church's Mission of Catholic Education




The definitive aim of catechesis (or the Church's teaching ministry) is to put people not only in touch, but also in communion and intimacy with Jesus Christ.

animated by communion and community based on the Gospel values of Jesus Christ...



The Tasks of Teaching the Faith



Catholic School Principal = Catechetical Leader



Principal as Catechetical Leader

- -Practicing Catholic...understands and is true to the faith.
- -Recognizes that all staff is integral to the mission of Catholic Education
- -Recruits teachers who are practicing Catholics...role models of faith
- -Fosters a Christian community
- -Follows guidelines set by diocese
- -Provides for ongoing spiritual and religious growth of faculty and student body
- -Embraces his/her role as a Parish and Archdiocesan Leader

Practical Points to be the Spiritual Leader

- YOU were called to principal of your school this year.
- Begin EVERY meeting with a prayer. Create your own spontaneous prayer or template of one. It may be uncomfortable at first.
- Example: Heavenly Father, send your Holy Spirit to be us during this meeting. Calm any fears or anxieties we are experiencing. Allow us to be open and honest with each other. Allow us to grow in love of You as a result of this meeting.
- Pray to the patron saint of your school.
- Give your school to God every night for Him to take care.
- Send a spiritual message out. Consider a scripture or inspirational quote.
- Catholic Visuals should be throughout the school. What is the condition of the items the crucifix, statues

- When you get up in the morning say, "Good Morning, God."
- Use something to praise God as the password on your computer. Ex: Glory2God, Praiseb2Him, Godisgood! Jesus#1, Mary#2
- Pray a decade of the rosary on your way to work in the car.
- Listen to Catholic/Christian music in the car.
- Say prayers over the PA. Morning, Grace Before and After Meals, End of the day the Act of Contrition.
- Consider asking your teachers to give written religion
 homework every night. Why? Only the important subjects have
 written homework.
- Religion across the curriculum art, music, social studies, science

- A History
- -- Post Vatican II (1962-65): Lay teachers may teach religion
- --Archdiocese of Philadelphia
 - *Cadet Program- circa 1955
 - *early 1970's: lay greater than religious; from secular colleges
 - *Circa 1974—LAY TEACHER Catechetical Certification/courses
 - N.B.: full time elementary teachers are teachers of religion
 - *By 1980: <u>levels</u> with the advent of part-time enrichment teachers or full time, non-religion teachers
 - *Circa 1974-1995: Teacher and school held records

Catechetical Certification Policy (2006-present)



16 credits

- + Orientation DAY
- + 8 (10 Hr.), 1 credit core courses or DVDS on basic tenets of the faith
- +Catholic College credits may be accepted
- +7 (less then 10 hr.) elective courses
- +Annual Update

All principals should be certified catechist.
